Background

Please Touch Museum, the Children's Museum of Philadelphia (PTM) was founded in 1976 and was the first children's museum to focus exclusively on young children ages birth to seven. PTM is multidisciplinary, providing exhibits and programs in the visual and performing arts, including theater, music and dance, literacy, humanities, math and science. PTM's exhibits are themed environments that are hands-on and interactive helping children to learn, develop and practice the skills and social skills they need to be ready for and successful in school and in future careers. The mission of Please Touch Museum is to change a child's life as they discover the power of learning through play. In 2008 PTM moved to Memorial Hall in Fairmount Park, a National Historic Landmark Building built for the 1876 Centennial Exhibition.

Position Summary:

The Exhibits Sanitation Assistant works closely with both the Exhibits and Museum Learning teams to complete daily cleaning tasks associated with the sanitation of exhibit props, costumes, and manipulatives. The Exhibits Sanitation Assistant works primarily from the Sanitation Room on the Lower Level of the Museum and will be required to support the Exhibits Technician-Props Specialist in his/her/their responsibilities as well. Those additional responsibilities include assisting with the collection of dirty props, costumes, and manipulatives from locations throughout the Museum and assisting with the distribution of clean props, costumes, and manipulatives back into the Museum's exhibits.

The Exhibits Sanitation Assistant will be required to follow strict safety and sanitation protocols with respect to the various objects that are being cleaned. When assigned, the Exhibit Sanitation Assistant will be required to assist the Exhibit Technician-Props Specialist in basic tasks associated with the fabrication, organization, and storage of props and manipulatives; and assist in other duties as assigned.

Essential Functions:

- Completes thorough sanitizing of all props, costumes, and manipulatives according to strict sanitizing protocols and the Exhibits cleaning schedule.
- Assist, the Exhibit Technician-Props Specialist, in basic tasks associated with the fabrication, organization, and storage of props and manipulatives.
- Maintain an exhibit sanitation program through regularly scheduled inspections, checklists and documentation to the Director of Exhibitions.
- Assist in the collection of dirty props from the Museum and the distribution of clean props throughout the Museum on a bi-weekly basis.

- Will train; experience working in a Museum or similar environment in a related field a plus
- Experience operating an industrial washer and dryer a plus.
- Demonstrated experience in working in a team.
- Good oral communication skills.
